Career Trends for 2015

EDUCATION AND TRAINING

The Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) determines that education, related work experience, and on-the-job training is typically needed for jobs.

19 of the 30 jobs projected to grow fastest from 2012 to 2022 typically

require some form of education/training beyond high school for entry.

Jobs typically requiring education/training beyond high school for entry generally had higher median wages (\$57,770) in 2012 and are projected to grow faster (14.0 percent) between 2012 and 2022 than jobs that typically require a high school diploma or less (\$27,670 and 9.1 %).

permanently leave an occupation. Job openings due to replacement needs are expected in every occupation, even in those predicted to decline in employment.

Over the 2012-2022 decade, 50.6 million total job openings are expected. While growth will lead to many openings, more than two-thirds (or 67.2 percent) are predicted to come from replacement needs.

In more than 4 out of 5 jobs, openings from replacement needs are predicted to exceed openings from growth.
